Columbia Club of Milton, Inc. (CCMI)

Annual elections of the CCMI Board of Directors and Board Officers is scheduled for the 9th of August, 2018 immediately following the KofC Council 7027 business meeting. The elections are expected to take 5-15 minutes. As the CCMI board draws its members from the general membership of the KofC Council 7027 it is important to have as many council members present at this meeting as possible. Please plan to attend.

Background. The CCMI is a not-for-profit corporation formed to own and manage the building and property located at 5470 Dogwood Drive in Milton (the "Old Knight's Hall") in support of the KofC Council 7027, its mission and that of the Order of the Knights of Columbus. Knights of Columbus councils are prohibited from owning property so the management of such property does not interfere with the goals of the Knights of Columbus.

The CCMI Board of Directors draws its members from the general membership of the KofC Council 7027 by a vote for each position on the board. There are 3 upcoming vacancies to be filled. Any member in good standing of the KofC Council 7027 that is not an elected officer of the council is eligible to serve on the CCMI board. The CCMI board consists of 7 members, 4 officers and 3 members at large. The term of service for a CCMI board member is for a minimum of 1 year but generally runs for 3 years. An attempt is made to stagger board member terms to prevent a loss of corporate knowledge.

DEACON'S TEACHING By Deacon Chris Christopher

The Pater Noster (The Lord's Prayer)

"The Lord's Prayer [the 'Our Father'] is the most perfect of prayers... In it we ask, not only for all the things we can rightly desire, but also in the sequence they should be desired. This prayer not only teaches us to ask for things, but also in what order we should desire them" (Thomas Aquinas, CCC 2763).

The Our Father is venerated by Christians because Jesus taught us the way to pray: *"This is how you are to pray..."* (Matthew 6:9) and *"When you pray, say..."* (Luke 11:2). The initial words on this prayer from the Catechism of the Catholic Church teach that it *"is truly the summary of the whole gospel"* (CCC 2761).

Two versions of this prayer are recorded in the gospels: a longer form in the Gospel of Matthew (6:9-13), and a shorter form in the Gospel of Luke (11:2-4). The Matthew account alone includes the *"Your will be done"* and the *"Rescue us from the evil one"* (or *"Deliver us from evil"*) petitions. Some Christians, particularly Protestants, conclude the prayer with a doxology, a later addendum appearing in some manuscripts of Matthew. This prayer is used by most Christian churches in their worship service; with few exceptions, it is the Matthew form used.

[The following **bold headings** are taken

from the Liturgy of the Hours]

Our Prayer is Communal: We do not say *"My Father, who art in heaven,"* nor *"Give me this day my daily bread."* It is not for oneself alone that each asks to be forgiven, not to be led into temptation or to be delivered from evil. Rather, we pray in public as a community for we the people of God are all one. We should bear in mind and realize that when we call God our Father we ought also to act like sons and daughters. If we are pleased to call him Father, let him in turn be pleased to call us his children.

May Your Name Be Hallowed: It is not that we think to make God holy by our prayers; rather we are asking God that his name may be made holy in us. Indeed, how could God be made holy, He who is the source of holiness? Because He himself said *"Be holy, for I am holy,"* we pray and beseech him that we who have been hallowed in baptism may persevere in what we have begun.

Your kingdom come: We pray that God's kingdom will become present for us in the same way that we ask for his name to be hallowed among us, that the kingdom promised to us by God will come, the kingdom won by Christ's blood and passion. However, it could also be that the kingdom of God whose coming for which we daily wish, is Christ himself since it is his coming for which we long. He is our resurrection since we will rise again in him.

Your will be done in earth, as it is in heaven: We pray not that God should do



his will, but that we may carry out his will. How could anyone prevent the Lord from doing what He wills? Rather, in our prayer we ask that God's will be done in us because the devil throws up obstacles to prevent our mind and conduct from obeying him in all things. If we pray that his will be done in us we are acknowledging that we need his help and protection. No one can be strong enough by his own strength, save by God's mercy and forgiveness.

Give us this day our daily bread: We can understand this petition in a spiritual or in a material sense, for in the divine plan of salvation they are both helpful. Christ is the bread of life; this bread does not belong to everyone, but is ours alone. When we say, our Father, we understand that He is the father of those who know him and believe in him. In the same way we speak of our daily bread, because Christ is the bread of those who touch his body. We who live in Christ and receive his Eucharist ask for this bread every day, because otherwise, we are to abstain from this communion due to some serious sin. We therefore become separated from the body of Christ as He taught, *"I am the bread of life which has come down from heaven. Any who eats my bread will live forever and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world...If you do not eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood you will have no life in you"* (John 6:51). We who live and abide in him will never be separated from his body and his grace.

And forgive us our trespasses: To be reminded that we are sinners and forced to ask forgiveness for our faults is prudent and sound. This command to pray daily for our sins reminds us that we commit sin every day. No one should complacently think of oneself as totally innocent, lest pride lead to further sin.

As we forgive those who trespass against us: Through this petition we are made aware that we cannot obtain what we ask

regarding our own trespasses unless we do the same for those who trespass against us. This is why Christ said, *"The measure with which you measure will in turn be measured out to you"* (Luke 6:38). And to the servant who, after his master forgave all his debt and refused to forgive his fellow servant is thrown into prison. We will have no excuses on the Day of Judgment, for we will be judged just as we have judged, and we'll suffer whatever we have done to others.

And lead us not into temptation: In this petition we are reminding ourselves to ask that his help may not depart from us; otherwise we could be seduced and consent to some temptation or despair and yield to it.

Deliver us from evil: This petition reminds us to reflect that we do not yet enjoy the state of blessedness in which we shall suffer no evil. Christians can utter cries of sorrow and shed tears, but even through them all they can still successfully conclude this prayer in hope and joy in whatever state of distress they are in.

The Lord's Prayer is the model prayer of the Church. It is an integral part of the major hours of the Divine Office and of the sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Integrated into the Eucharist it reveals the eschatological character of its petitions, hoping for the Lord *"until he comes"* (1 Cor 11:26).

MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church

Wednesday August 15, 2018 7:00 am

(Unload Truck 6:00 am after 5:30 am Mass of the Assumption)



The Mobile Food Pantry Program helps serve clients in areas of high need by offering a single day mass food distribution to agencies in rural counties that may not have regular access to the food bank, do not have a large storage area, or have a higher need in their communities.

Program Specifics: Each mobile food pantry provides an assortment of critical need items, feeding up to 100 families in need in a single distribution. The truck will deliver the food the morning of the distribution, relieving the need for our parish to store food. All food will be distributed the same day. The food bank sources perishable food through their Retail Store Level Pickup Program, and supplements the donated food items with food they buy in bulk opportunities. Typical loads include: fresh produce (fruits and vegetables) and bakery items (breads and pastries); frozen meat (varies); shelf stable items (canned and dry goods); and beverages and dairy products.

The Silver Rose Icon One of the Knights of Columbus Silver Rose Icons is now traveling the United States as it wends its way to Mexico. This is a commemorative Icon of the apparition of the Virgin Mother, Our Lady of Guadalupe, when she appeared to a peasant Indian, Juan Diego. She appeared to him twice, once on December 9 and again on December 12, 1531 on Tepeyac Hill, near Mexico City. She made a request of Juan Diego, "Build me a shrine on this hill". He went to see the Bishop who did not believe his story, without proof. When Juan Diego did return to the vision, he relayed the words of the Bishop to the Virgin Mary. She instructed him to go up on top of the hill and pick the roses, not in season in December, and bring them to her. He did so and she arranged them in his cloak, telling him to take the cloak full of roses to the bishop. When he arrived to see the bishop and opened his cloak to show him the roses, the bishop was awestruck at the colorful impression of the Blessed Mary the roses had made on the cloak.

This shrine in Mexico City is one of the

most visited in our faith, and the cloak of Juan Diego is on display in the Basilica, perfectly preserved with the wondrous image of the Virgin Mary that had been miraculously made by the roses.

Thus, the Silver Rose is a symbol of that miracle, our most revered Mother, to all Knights and Catholics.
