

The Easter Triduum

As we come to the close of our Lenten Season, we reach its climax during Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday and ending with the Triduum. If you feel you haven't made much progress growing in holiness during this period, make an effort to enter this final week with renewed enthusiasm, and maybe, just maybe, you'll catch on fire.

Palm Sunday (Passion Sunday)

commemorates our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem just days before the completion of his earthly ministry of redemption for mankind. Parishioners usually assemble outside the church where the palms are blessed, are handed their palms, and then process either around the church or nearby neighborhood behind the clergy and acolytes all the while singing a familiar hymn of adoration.

At this Mass the entire Passion of Jesus is the Gospel reading, usually read with various speaking parts.

Holy Thursday begins the Easter Triduum, which is Latin for "three days," Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Liturgically, though, it is one day beginning with this Mass and ending with the Easter Vigil on Saturday night.

As evidence of this, you'll notice that on Thursday there is an opening of Mass as usual, but no final blessing and dismissal after it. The Good Friday service is just that, a Service, not a Mass. At the Easter Vigil on Saturday night, you'll notice that there is no opening of Mass since it occurred on Holy Thursday, but there is a blessing and dismissal at its end, which completes the three-day Triduum.

Holy Thursday is commonly known as the Mass of the Last Supper. On this day we remember that Jesus gave himself in the Eucharist, chose his apostles to serve and lead the Church, and then washed their feet. Our pastor will reenact this foot washing ritual on some parishioners. Holy Thursday is a special day for

all priests since it is a day to mark the beginning of the ordained priesthood. It concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the tabernacle of repose in the chapel where Eucharistic adoration is encouraged. The main altar is then stripped.

Good Friday recalls the passion and crucifixion of Jesus through the reading of the Passion According to John. During this service parishioners may come forward to venerate the Cross by either kissing it, touching it, or reverencing it with a bow. Since Mass is not celebrated, communion is distributed with consecrated hosts in reserve from Holy Thursday. Images of saints may, in accordance with local custom, be veiled and votive lights before them extinguished. Crucifixes that are movable are removed, while those that cannot are veiled until after the Good Friday service.

Holy Saturday is a commemoration of the day that Jesus lay in his tomb and Masses are never offered.

Easter Vigil is a celebration from Darkness to the Light of Christ, the Resurrection, and is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday or before dawn on Easter Sunday. The paschal candle, representing Jesus' resurrection as the "*return of light into the world*," is lit, usually from an open fire outside the church.

People receiving full initiation in the Church are given the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist during this Mass.

Hopefully with the aid of this short outline, you'll be better able to see the continuity and significance of Holy Week and benefit from becoming more fully engaged in it. May you have a fruitful conclusion to Lent.

The Blackwater Pyrates is sponsoring a *Blessing of the Fleet* on **Saturday 29 May at 1 p.m.**

Msgr. Reed, accompanied by our Color Guard and bagpipers, will conduct the Blessing at the Memorial Park Boardwalk in downtown Milton. All watercraft whether motor, man, or wind powered - should circle in front of the Milton Memorial Park boardwalk until the Blackwater Pyrate lead boat begins the slow, single file pass-by for individual blessings.

Those wishing to participate in the blessing but do not own a boat may ride with Dcn. Chris on his pontoon boat – rendezvous at the Milton Memorial Park pavilion by 12:30 p.m. (12-person legal capacity)

Coast Guard Vessel Inspection

Whether your vessel is motor, wind or man powered, the Blackwater Pyrates -- in conjunction with the US Coast Guard Auxiliary – is sponsoring its annual free water vessel examination day on **Saturday 29 May** from **9 a.m. to 12 p.m.** at *Carpenter's Park* and *Russell Harbor* boat landings in Milton.

Vessels passing the inspection will receive an annual sticker for the vessel acknowledging the pass. As this is *not* a law enforcement inspection, vessels not passing will be given a checklist of deficiencies, but *not* a citation. Within reason and available resources, deficiencies will be corrected free of charge by the Blackwater Pyrates on the spot.



- A. Jesus
- B. Crown of Thorns
- C. Jesus of Nazareth King of the Jews
- D. Darkened Sun
- E. Lightning
- F. Veil in the Temple

- H. Roman Soldier (Longinus)

- A. Jesus — There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus in the middle. Jn 19:18
- B. Crown of Thorns — Weaving a crown out of thorns,* they placed it on his head Mt 27:29
- C. Jesus of Nazareth King of the Jews — Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, "Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews." Jn 19:19
- D. Darkened Sun — It was now about noon and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon because of an eclipse of the sun. Mt27:45
- E. Lightning
- F. Veil in the Temple — And behold, the veil of the sanctuary was torn in two from top to bottom. Mt 27:51
- G. Bad Thief — (see L)
- H. Roman Soldier (Longinus) — The centurion and the men with him who were keeping watch over Jesus feared greatly when they saw the earthquake and all that was happening, and they said, "Truly, this was the Son of God!" Mt 27:54
- I. Mary Magdalen — There were also women looking on from a distance. Among them were Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of the younger James and of Joses, and Salome. Mk 15:40
- J. Skull of Adam — They brought him to the place of Golgotha (which is translated Place of the Skull). Mk 15:22
- K. Mary and John the Apostle — When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home. Jn 19:26-27
- L. Good Thief (Dysmas) — Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Lk 23:39-43
- M. City Wall — the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city Jn 19:20
- N. Tomb — Now in the place where he had been crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had yet been buried. Jn 19:41
