Summer is in full swing; vacations and backyard barbeques, outdoor sports and yardwork! I look forward to this time of year with flowers in bloom and thoughts of a much needed and anticipated summer vacation. I hope your summer is going well for you!

In last month's message I mentioned taking

stock of all the things that need to be done around the house. And I further suggested that taking stock should extend to seeing where you and your family stand when it comes to financial protection. It's interesting to read about Blessed Michael McGivney's attitude in Faith and Fraternalism by Christopher J. Kauffman: "Though he [Fr. McGivney] seems to have been well aware of the value of ceremonials as the binding force for fraternal unity, he spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature." You know the story well; how the untimely death of his father nearly derailed Fr. McGivney's plans to become a priest. As the curate of St. Mary's he encountered families in similar situations. So it's no wonder he was so practical when it came to making sure families were financially sound. In my position I feel a deep kinship with Fr. McGivney in helping to protect Catholic families. I see myself as your partner in facing this planning process. You don't have to go it alone. With our new financial needs analysis tool, with cutting edge software, robust and in-depth, we can approach this together. Since my last message a number of members reached out to me. Let me give you a fictionalized account about two of them. I recently met with a brother Knight and his wife who have a couple of young children. Together, we were able to see that based on what this couple wanted for their family, there was a need in two particular areas. One, the brother's group life insurance, while free as a benefit, was not enough to do what he wanted his life insurance to do. He desired more

to make sure, if he had an untimely passing, his

wife and children could stay in the same home, could still attend Catholic grade school and could afford to make a college education a reality. The other area that he had not thought about was what I call the "death of his earning power." What if he became sick or hurt and could not work? His employer provided very minimal coverage for a few months, but after that there was nothing. We explored how the Knights could fill that void and make his family whole. All this from spending time with me. The best part for him...and for you, is that this service is absolutely free. Many others in the industry charge fees for this kind of analysis. It's a fraternal benefit that I am happy to provide.

The other couple was recently retired. Well past the stage of this former young couple. I completed a financial needs analysis for them. They were in very good shape financially; had all their proverbial ducks in a row in almost every area. The area that they were concerned with was an extended care event. How could they protect all that they had worked for and saved in the event of needing help with daily living activities? I was able to help them plan for that and shift the financial burden to the Knights. The other issue they looked at was setting aside a little of what they had saved to help their grandchildren. We were able to set up a plan to pass that money tax free to them.

Maybe you have similar concerns; meeting with me can allay them. I am your partner as we share our brotherhood in the Order. That kind of relationship is rarely found elsewhere in the financial services world. Let's get together and see where you stand.

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Deacon's Teaching

The Power of Holy Water

In the first verses of Genesis we read of the mysterious relationship of

water to creation as the Spirit moves over the waters. In the Book of Numbers, it is noted how the ancient Israelites blessed their homes and belongings with water. Likewise, the ancient Romans made use of water to bless their fields and houses. Both the Jewish and pagan practice foreshadows the use of holy water in the Christian epoch. Some of the earliest apostolic tradition testifies to its use. Around A.D. 130, Pope Alexander in his Apostolic Constitutions wrote: "We bless salt and water for the people, that all who may be sprinkled therewith may be cleansed and sanctified."

So, from the earliest times, then, we find reference to the faithful, many of whom were to give their lives as a witness to the Lord in martyrdom after having been sprinkled with holy water at Mass.

In theological terms, holy water is a sacramental, not a sacrament. Through a sacramental, actual grace is obtained which enables us to *act*; it is the strength that God gives us to act according to his will. It is a temporary supernatural act of God to help us become holy.*

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that sacramentals operate by means of the Church's intercession. We are taught that by the pious use of holy water, the intellect is enlightened, and the will moved from evil while being prompted to do good.

Using Holy Water is an ancient sacramental. Blessed Pope Pius IX ⁽¹⁷⁹²⁻¹⁸⁷⁸⁾ knew this when he said, "Holy Water has a special power to defend us against

all attacks of the devil." And there is an additional benefit. He said that "When we make the sign of the cross with holy water, we gain an indulgence," which he renewed in 1876.

Each time we make the sign of the cross with holy water, we gain an indulgence of one hundred days under the following conditions We <u>must</u>:

- (1) Make the sign of the cross with holy water blessed by a Catholic priest.
- (2) Say, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."
- (3) Have genuine contrition for our sins.
 - (4) Be in the state of grace.*

If Confession is not available for any valid reason, make a heart-felt Act of Contrition privately before God, with the full intention of going to Confession as soon as possible.

And if holy water is not available? If you have access to a priest, you have access to holy water. Take a bottle of tap water from your home and go to a priest and ask him to bless it. Holy water is also important for the protection of your home, car, boat, bicycle, etc., and of course your family.

Holy water is significant as:

1. A sign of repentance of

sin,

- 2. Protection from evil, and
- 3. A reminder of our

Baptism.

First, the repentance of sin



symbolized in the washing with water is reflected in Psalm 50: "Have mercy on me, O God, in your goodness; in the greatness of your compassion wipe out my offense. Thoroughly wash me from my guilt and of my sin cleanse me."

Remember too how St. John the Baptizer called all to conversion and used a ritual washing of water to signify the repentance of sin and purification.

These actions have been incorporated into our own Mass. In the Penitential Rite, one of the options is the Asperges, which includes the Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling with Holy Water. As the priest passes through the congregation sprinkling them with the Holy Water, they customarily chant the Asperges Me, which is based on Psalm 50. In all, each person again makes an act of repentance of sin.

Second, the Holy Water protects us against evil. In the prayer of blessing of water in the Sacramentary, we read: "Lord, God Almighty, creator of all life, of body and soul, we ask you to bless this water: as we use it in faith forgive our sins and save us from all illness and the power of evil. Lord, in your mercy give us living water, always springing up as a fountain of salvation; free us, body and soul, from every danger, and admit us to your presence in purity of heart." Catholic tradition has long held that holy water is a substantial force for keeping evil at bay.

A proponent who wrote specifically about this in 1562 is Saint Teresa of Avila:

"From long experience I have learned that there is nothing like holy water to put devils to flight and prevent them from coming back again. They also flee from the Cross, but return; so holy water must have great virtue."

Third, Holy Water reminds us of our Baptism. By the invocation of the Holy Trinity and the pouring of Holy Water, we were set free from Original Sin and all sin, infused with sanctifying grace, incorporated into the Church, and given the title Son or Daughter of God. In making the sign of the cross with the Holy Water, we are mindful that we are called to renew those baptismal promises of rejecting Satan, all His works, and all his empty promises, and to profess our credal faith.

Like Moses before the children of Israel in the 30th chapter of Deuteronomy, we would do well to sprinkle holy water over our families and our homes, and, by so doing, choosing life and casting out death and all its accomplices.

*Actual Grace vs Sanctifying Grace: Sanctifying grace is a state in which God allows us to share in his life and love. When we speak of being in the state of grace, we mean the state of sanctifying grace; there is no mortal sin in us. This grace comes to us first in baptism and then in the other sacraments.

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Dear Knights of Columbus -

First of all, I would like to thank each and every one of you for your continued thoughts and prayers during Kenneth's illness. The power of prayer is amazing, and your prayers have brought us through the darkest times. Especially on this day, when the readings begin with, "God did not make death ..." I would like to share with you an update on member Kenneth Young.

Monsignor Reed came to the hospital to bless him with the Last Rites of the church. Kenneth could not take communion because of continuous coughing and choking. When Kenneth came home from the hospital on May 21st, he was on three liters of oxygen and Hospice wanted to set a hospital bed for him. He was completely limp and lifeless and could barely turn over in bed for me to care for him. He slept constantly. At times he would call out, "Yes! Hello," as though he was seeing longforgotten loved ones and friends. He would lift his arm to them and smile, even though he was apparently still asleep. I was afraid he would surely die before our family could get down to see him.

On one occasion, he was smiling in his sleep again. His face was just so serene, content and happy all at one time. He reached his hand up, took something out of the air, closed his hand around it carefully, and put his hand to his mouth. I just knew he was taking communion from the hand of angels. No matter what happened, it would be alright.

As our family cycled through, one family at a time, we were blessed to see an incredible change in his condition and will to live. One grandson, the first to visit, shaved him every day for five days until he could hold the razor himself. That first night, at 2am, Kenneth fully woke up for the first time and wanted ice cream. And at 4am. And at 6am and at 8am. We were overjoyed that he could sit in the wheel-chair and enjoy being fed a small amount of ice cream.

Kenneth no longer uses oxygen. He can sit in the wheelchair for about two hours and watch a little TV. He tasted a little of everything when the kids and grandkids were here. He loves pancakes and strawberries for breakfast every morning. We are still having ice cream parties at 2am on a lot of nights!

This gift from God may last just one more day, or 100. Regardless, your prayers and Kenneth's faith have allowed him to visit with our children and all of our grand-children. We can never thank you enough.

May God bless each one of you richly for your faith, your charity of fellowship, your unity of prayers and the fraternity that you have showered on us in this dark time. Until we are together again, may God hold you in the palm of His hand.
