Love is in the air! We spend a lot of time thinking about our loved ones during the month of February and especially around Valentine's Day. Technically, it's St. Valentine's Day, originally the feast day of a Roman saint from the third century. There is much speculation about the origins of the feast and even some discussion about the identity of the saint. We do know that this St. Valentine was martyred on February 14, 269 and the feast day was instituted by Pope Gelasius I in 496. But how did St. Valentine, a martyr, come to be associated with love and romance? Again, there is much speculation and one popular story is that he cured the blind daughter of his jailer. Before he was led off to his death, he wrote her a note and signed it "Your Valentine."

Unlike St. Valentine, most of us are not called to martyrdom, but we do think about our loved ones...and we write love notes and greeting cards. Gifts are commonly given to the ones we love. But have you ever considered some special gifts for the ones you love?

Deacon's Teaching

When Do We Bow Our Heads at Mass?

The faithful are asked to make this simple gesture several times during the liturgy.

Among the lesser-known gestures at Mass is the action of bowing the head. It is a simple movement used in many different cultures as a sign of respect and has its own place within the Catholic liturgy.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) explains, "A bow signifies reverence and honor shown to the persons themselves or to the signs that represent them. There are two kinds of bows: a bow of the head and a bow of the body [also known as a profound bow]." The GIRM then lays out several moments during the Mass when those present should bow:

1) During the Creed – "The Creed is sung or recited by the priest together with the people (no. 68) with everyone standing. At the words *et incarnatus est* (by the power of the Holy Spirit . . . and became man) all make a profound bow; but on the solemnities of the Annunciation and of the Nativity of the Lord, all genuflect" (GIRM 137).

2) After the consecration (if you are not kneeling) – "In the dioceses of the United States of America, [the faithful] should kneel beginning after the singing or recitation of the Sanctus until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer, except when prevented on occasion by reasons of health, lack of space,

the large number of people present, or some other good reason. Those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the priest genuflects after the consecration" (GIRM 43).

3) Before receiving the Holy Eucharist at Communion – "When receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence and receives the Body of the Lord from the minister" (GIRM 160).

4) During a solemn blessing at the end of Mass – "If a prayer over the people or a solemn formula for the blessing is used, the deacon says, *Inclinate vos ad benedictionem* (Bow down and pray for God's blessing)" (GIRM 185).

5) When hearing the name of God or specific saints – "A bow of the head is made when the three Divine Persons are named together and at the names of Jesus, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of the Saint in whose honor Mass is being celebrated" (GIRM 275). As an aside, you'll notice that we are in a short period of Ordinary time between Christmas Tide and Lent. Due to Easter being a moveable feast, this year that interval will only be seven weeks long.

Next month we'll take a quick look at **Ash Wednesday and the Lenten Season.**

I again must thank all our volunteers for their help, because without them none of this would be possible.


