Field Agent's Report

My Brothers all,

As we approach the end of the year and our thoughts turn to the angelic declaration of "Peace on Earth" and "Goodwill to Men!" We remember Pope Francis' Prayer for Peace where he prays "Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!...Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last..." In our lives there is much going on: scurrying around buying a Christmas tree, getting it decorated; looking for that perfect gift for our spouse, our kids and maybe grandkids. There are parties and school Christmas shows. Seems like we're busier than ever. But let me ask you to slow down for just a few minutes and consider some financial issues that come up at the end of the calendar year.

- 1. Because we're so late in the year, you may have met your individual or family deductible on your health insurance plan. Financially this may be the opportune time for some minor procedure to be scheduled; or that visit to a specialist you may have put off. The same is true about dental insurance and sometimes even for vision coverage. Check with your Human Resource office or your health insurance carrier for details.
- 2. When it comes to health insurance, do you have a Health Savings Account? Do you have to spend the money that's in there by year end? Some plans have a "use it or lose it" feature. Do you have to make a decision about how much to contribute next year? These are a couple

of time sensitive issues. Again, make sure you check with your HR office or health insurance carrier.

- 3. If you have earned income for the year, will you contribute to a traditional IRA, Roth IRA, or 401k? Are you eligible to contribute more based on the "catch up" provision? Now is the time to start making plans.
- 4. Speaking of IRAs, have you received your required minimum distribution for this year? If not, the Internal Revenue Service penalty is a hefty 50% of the amount you should have received!

All of these issues come with rules and regulations, and each individual situation is different. I'd be happy to discuss them with you. As we prepare to celebrate Christmas, let us be thankful for all the graces God has showered on us, especially the gift of his Son, our Savior! Vivat Jesus

Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher The "O Antiphons" of Advent

The Roman Church has been singing the "O Antiphons" since at least the eighth century; most likely they date to the sixth century. They are recited prior to the Magnificat during evening prayer (vespers) from Dec. 17 - 23.

prior to the Magnificat during evening prayer (vespers) from Dec. 17 - 23. Each antiphon is addressed to God using a noble title for the Messiah and petitions Him to come and save His people. This repeated imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah. Each antiphon is tied to Mary because she is the vessel through which the Savior will be born.

December 17 <u>O' Sapientia</u> (<u>Isaiah 11:2–3</u>; <u>28:29</u>). "<u>O Wisdom</u>, O holy Word of God, you govern all creation with your strong yet tender care. *Come* and show your people the way to salvation."

December 18 <u>O' Adonai</u> (<u>Isaiah</u> <u>33:22</u>). "<u>O Lord</u> of ancient Israel, who showed yourself to Moses in the burning bush, who gave him the holy law on Sinai Mountain: *come*, stretch out your mighty hand to set us free."

December 19 O'Radix (Isaiah 11:1; 11:10). "O Flower of Jesse's stem, you have been raised up as a sign for all peoples; kings stand silent in your presence; the nations bow down in worship before you. Come, let nothing keep you from coming to our aid.

December 20 <u>O' Clavis</u> (Isaiah 22:22) "<u>O Key of David</u>, O royal Power of Israel controlling at your will the gate of heaven: *come*, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead your captive people into freedom.

December 21 <u>O' Oriens</u>, (<u>Isaiah 9:1</u>) "<u>O Radiant Dawn</u> splendor of eternal light, the sun of justice: *come* and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death."

December 22 <u>O'Rex Gentium</u> (Isaiah 9:5; 2:4) "<u>O King of all nations</u>, the only joy of every human heart; O Keystone of the mighty arch of man, *come* and save the creature you fashioned from the dust.

December 23 <u>O'Emmanuel</u>(<u>Isaiah 7:14</u>) "<u>O Emmanuel</u>, king and lawgiver, desire of the nations, Savior of all people, *come* and set us free, Lord, our God.

If one starts with the last title and takes the first letter of each one - Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia - the Latin words ERO CRAS are formed, meaning, "Tomorrow, I will come." Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for in Advent and whom we have addressed in these seven Messianic titles, now speaks to us, "Tomorrow, I will come."

The O Antiphons not only bring intensity to our Advent preparation but bring it to a joyful conclusion.

Next month we'll look at **Epiphany**.



"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples ..." (Gospel for Dec. 31, Lk 2:29-31)

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:


