# Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday

As we come to the close of our Lenten Season, we reach its climax during Holy Week

beginning with Palm Sunday and ending with the Triduum. If you feel you haven't made much progress growing in holiness during this period, try to enter this final week with renewed enthusiasm, and maybe, just maybe, you'll catch on fire.

Palm Sunday commemorates our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover just days before the completion of his earthly ministry. We see Jesus riding into the city on a donkey. He did so for several reasons:

First, it fulfilled the Old Testament prophecy (Zechariah 9:9) that the Messiah would ride a donkey into Jerusalem.

Second, the donkey symbolizes peace, humility, and servitude rather than a conquering king arriving on a horse. In so doing He emphasized the humility that was to characterize the Kingdom he proclaimed.

The irony of his acceptance as the new Davidic King (Mark 11:10) by the crowds who would only five days later cry for his execution should be a sobering reminder of the human tendency to want God on our terms.

Although Palm Sunday reminds us of the triumphant arrival of Christ, it also reminds us of the fickle and tenuous nature of life. If Christ can go from a triumphant hero adored by thousands - to death in one of the most horrible manners in less than a week, should we be surprised when we sometimes see our life turn from good to bad so suddenly? If it can happen to Jesus, the greatest person to ever walk the Earth, why can't it also happen to us?

God controls the lives of believers and non-believers, Christians, and non-Christians alike. Fame is fleeting, and life is short. Good times and bad times come and go. The lesson of Palm Sunday is that anyone can have their fortunes and their lives, change dramatically overnight.

But the lesson of Easter is that God keeps his promise to open the gates of heaven for us.


This Sunday is also known as **Passion Sunday** because the entire Passion of Jesus is read. The English word *passion* comes from a Latin word that means "*to suffer*," the same word from which we derive the English word *patient*.

Being within the Lenten Season whose color is purple, in Catholic tradition, the color is changed to Red for Palm Sunday. Red is the color used for <u>Pentecost</u> as well as remembering the martyrs of the church. Since it symbolizes shed blood, it is also used on Palm/Passion Sunday to symbolize the death of Jesus.

In contrast, during the entire year, Sunday services are always celebrations of the Resurrection of Jesus. The emphasis on the Passion of Jesus on this Sunday should not be mournful or end on a negative note, as do most Good Friday Services, which is why the Eucharist is not celebrated on Good Friday.

What virtues do you see in St. Joseph as you read the Gospel narratives about the nativity and early life of Jesus? How well do you practice these virtues in your own life, not only as a husband or father, but as a faithful disciple of Jesus? What specific, concrete things can you do to grow in these virtues in your day-to-day life?

#### **Appeal for Support of Florida Knights of Columbus Charities**


